

Work Type	Definition / Examples
<b>AD - Administration</b>	For recording vacation time, sick time, and for meetings.
<b>CA - Calibration</b>	Setting or correcting of a measuring device.
<b>CM - Corrective Maintenance</b>	Work performed to correct a fault in equipment or a facility that results in restoration to its intended condition.
<b>EM - Emergency Maintenance Work</b>	Corrective maintenance work performed to correct a fault that could cause a critical infrastructure to be inoperable, life safety issues, or harm to research.
<b>ES - Estimating</b>	Estimate of labor and material costs.
<b>EV - Event Report</b>	For logging data or readings (history log).
<b>GS - General Services</b>	Service work not focused on correcting or preventing a fault on equipment or a facility. Examples are painting, moving tables & chairs, hanging items, installations, building walls, moving a lab, etc.
<b>IN - Inspection Work</b>	Includes testing (for example, backflow preventers, emergency lights, verify sheet metal according to standards).
<b>PD - Predictive Maintenance</b>	Activities performed based on process data aimed at the avoidance of maintenance problems by prediction of likely failure modes to prevent failures and/or extend the useful life or reliability of equipment or a facility.
<b>PM - Preventive Maintenance</b>	Activities performed based on a run time, or time interval basis, to prevent failures and/or extend the useful life or reliability of equipment or a facility.
<b>PW - Project Work</b>	Work that is not CM, PM, or PD, is planned, and takes more than 8 hours to complete. Only for WOs that fall under a Project SR.
<b>TR - Training</b>	Staff training & development.
